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Do Not Use a Record When... Cheat Sheet Revised March 1, 2023

When you've found a potential record for your item in WorkFlows or OCLC Connexion, keep the following in mind before adding your item to the record. Remember, a record that only somewhat matches is not a good fit for your item.

You do NOT want to use a record if:

- The pagination differs by more than 3 pages
- The size differs by more than 3 cm
 - It is okay for paperback and hardback books to be on the same record if all other match points are the same and the dimensions vary by no more than 3 cm
- The record includes bonus content, but your item does not—and vice-versa
- The record has the wrong publication date and/or publisher, even if everything else matches
- The runtime differs by more than 10 minutes for audiobooks or DVDs and Blurays
- The record lists the wrong number of discs

Keep in mind, the above "quick hitters" are not a comprehensive list of possible differences between your item and a potential record match. Please see below for more detailed lists of core match points:

Even with the more detailed match point lists, there may be other discrepancies between your item and a record that might justify using a different, better matching record. If you ever have any questions about which record to use, are unsure if a record is a good fit for your item, or simply cannot find a matching record, please create a brief record in WorkFlows to get your item circulating.
