

Non-Resident Library Services for Veterans Cheat Sheet

Last Updated: March 2022

Per the Illinois State Library, veterans that meet certain eligibility requirements* and live in an area unserved by a local library are entitled to a non-resident library card without a fee.

The normal rules for creating non-resident cards apply to Cards for Vets. See <u>RSA User Card Policy</u>.

What is Cards for Vets?

*A veteran with a service-connected disability of at least 70% who is exempt from paying property taxes on their primary residence due to the Homestead exemption for veterans with disabilities is entitled to a non-resident library card without a fee.

The non-resident fee shall not apply to veterans with a service-related disability of at least 70% who do not own their principal residence and who reside outside of a public library service area. The veteran shall present documentation of disability of at least 70% from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs when applying for their non-resident card.
