The document looks pretty good! I do have one question. The current Patron Card Policy contains information on checkout and hold restrictions for certain user profiles, non-RSA reciprocal borrowers, institutional cards, etc. That information is not in the new document. Will that information be going into a different document? - Yes, this has been added to the new User Profiles Guide here: https://support.librariesofrsa.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/09/User-Profiles-Guide-2025-09-12.pdf. Once this policy is approved this will become the User Profile Standard. This comment from Nick sparked a rethink of the draft policy.

Additionally, as a formatting note, my brain struggled with the italicized headings indicating new sections. If it doesn't go against a standardized formatting, you guys are moving to, it may be slightly easier to read with having the bold underlined headings, a larger font, and then the italicized headings being bold but regular-sized font. Again, this is a minor point, but I figured I'd suggest it. I have tried to update the headings to be clearer
