Cataloging Chat Survey Results

- The survey ran October through early November last year with 36 responses.
- Most prefer the hybrid meeting format (in-person and online), though there is also support for online only and recording only.

- Frequency in January, May, and September is just right.
- Most find the content helpful.

RSA Upgrade of Brief Records to OCLC Records

- 369 = Number of brief records upgraded since last September's Cataloging Chat
- RSA continues to work through a system-wide report of brief records with email addresses in their 592 fields, upgrading them to OCLC records.
- Thank you for sending your brief items! The upgrade to an OCLC record with full bibliographic description makes the item more discoverable in WorkFlows, the RSAcat, and OCLC WorldCat.
- If RSA places a hold on a brief item that you do not want upgraded, be sure to reply to our email. We will cancel the hold, delete the 592 field, and assign the OCLCEXCLUD item cat 6, so we do not contact you again about that item.

Refresher on OCLCEXCLUD item category 6

OCLCEXCLUD is used for two reasons:

When libraries create a brief record they do not want upgraded, they should put "leave as brief" in the 592 field and select OCLCEXCLUD as the ItemCat 6.

- Using OCLCEXCLUD allows RSA to easily identify items that should not be included in our internal brief record cleanup report.

A library can assign the OCLCEXCLUD ItemCat 6 to prevent OCLC WorldShare interlibrary loans.

- If OCLCEXCLUD is assigned to an item, RSA will not update the library's holding for that item during the next run of the process that batch updates OCLC holdings.
- Because the holding is not updated in OCLC, the item will not be visible for WorldShare interlibrary requests.
- A library can catalog their item on an OCLC record and still use OCLCEXCLUD. This way, the library benefits from the rich bibliographic description of the record for discoverability, but the library doesn't have their holding updated in OCLC for interlibrary loans.

Upcoming Cataloging Events

- Basic Cataloging Workshops – By the end of this month, BWFCWs will be scheduled on L2 monthly through the end of this year. April will be in-person at PR and September will be in-person at CK. Invitations to the BWFCWs will be shared on the Cataloging forum closer to the workshop dates.
- Bibload Workshops – These workshops are scheduled on L2 in May, August, and November. The August workshop will be in-person at RAILS East Peoria and include an optional delivery hub tour after the workshop.
